

HUNTING SAFETY *Tips for staying safe during hunting season*

Before you venture into areas where wildlife is present, remember to keep safety top of mind.

Before you leave:

- Make sure a friend or family member knows where you plan to hunt and when you plan to return. Put plans in writing, leaving one with a friend and one on your vehicle.
- Check the weather before you leave. Weather can change rapidly.
- Familiarize yourself with the terrain. Make sure you know the area where you will be hunting.

Pack accordingly:

Dress and pack appropriately. Be sure to check state and local requirements for high visibility attire for you and any canine companions.

Carry a First Aid kit and familiarize yourself with how to use it. While no one plans to get hurt while enjoying the outdoors, it does happen. Be prepared with necessary

First Aid items.

Stay alert:

- Always be alert of your surroundings and what others in your party are doing.
- Clearly identify your target before discharging your firearm.

The more of these precautions you follow, the safer your hunting trip will be.
